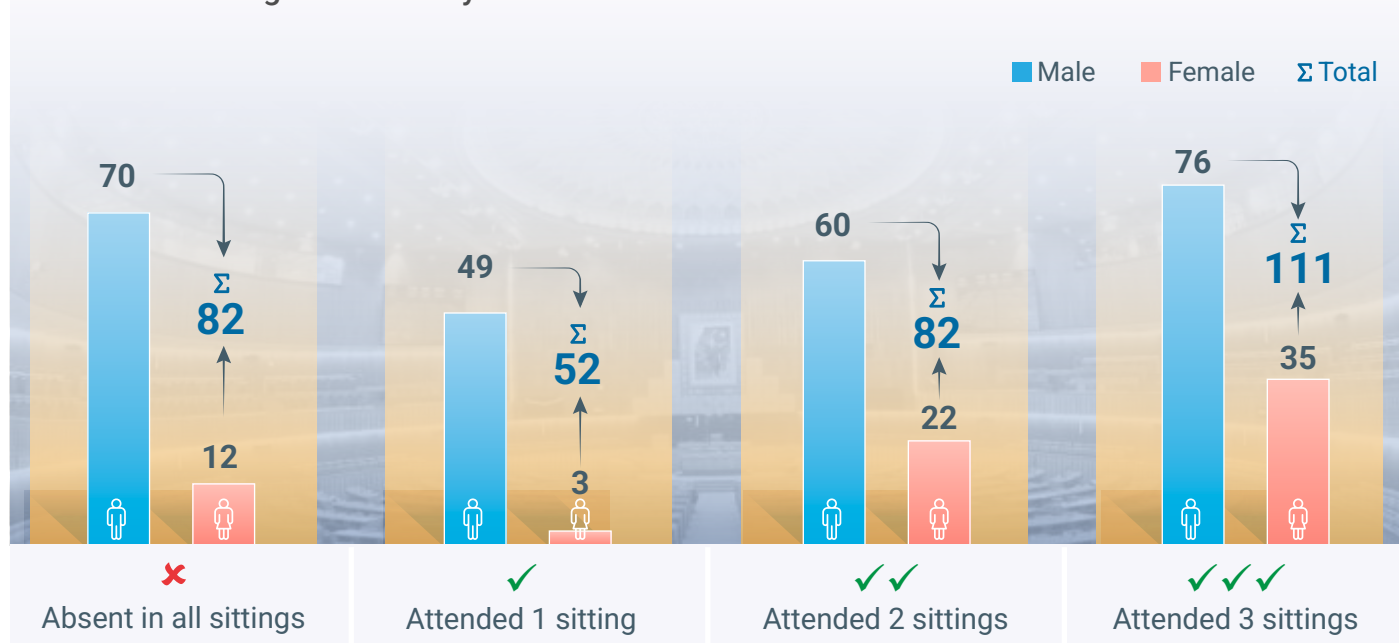

During the 19th session of the National Assembly, which spanned three sittings from September 1 to September 5, 2025, 111 members (34 percent) attended all sittings, while 82 members (25 percent) were absent for the entire session. Figure 1 below offers a gender-disaggregated breakdown of lawmakers based on the number of sittings they attended.

Key Highlights

- The second sitting had the highest number of MNAs (200 or 61 percent of current membership) present during the session.
- The third sitting had the lowest number of MNAs in attendance (159 or 49 percent).
- As many as 216 (66 percent) MNAs skipped at least one sitting during the session.
- As many as 50 (23 percent of 216) MNAs submitted applications for leave of absence during the session.
- As many as 166 (77 percent of 216) MNAs skipped the House proceedings without submitting any formal leave application in advance.
- Among the cabinet members, four federal ministers and one state minister attended all the sittings.
- The Prime Minister did not attend any of the sittings during the session.
- The Leader of the Opposition has not yet been officially declared in the National Assembly.

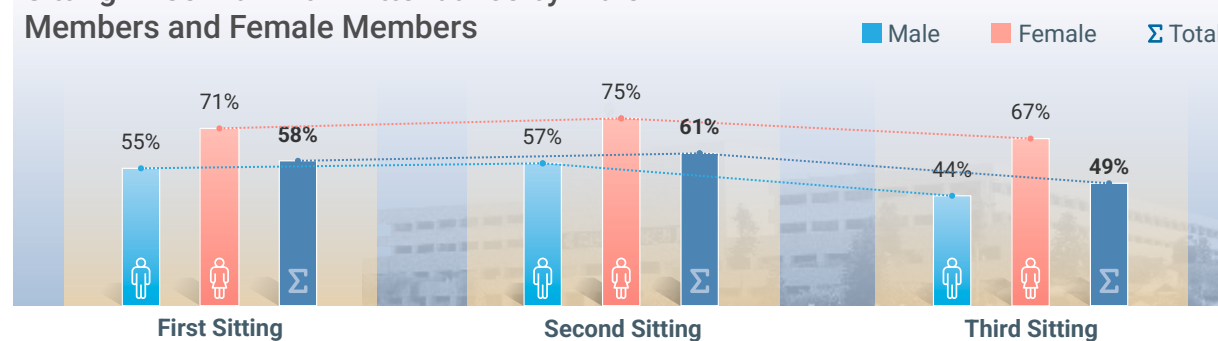
Attendance Patterns by Sitting

As in previous sessions, female members generally had higher attendance than their male counterparts. The second sitting saw the highest attendance, with 200 members (61 percent of the current membership) present at the meeting. This session was a Private Members' Day, during which the Minister for Housing and Works moved Motion 288 to suspend the agenda to discuss the country's flood situation under Motion 259, which had been previously introduced by the Minister for Parliamentary Affairs in the first

sitting. The lowest attendance occurred during the third (last) sitting, with only 159 members (49 percent) present. During this session, a member of the Sunni Ittehad Council (SIC) pointed out the lack of quorum. In response, the Speaker remarked that it was unfortunate for the quorum to be questioned during a discussion of such significant public importance, as members from Balochistan were seeking to address the flood issues. Nonetheless, a count was conducted, and the House was found to be in order.

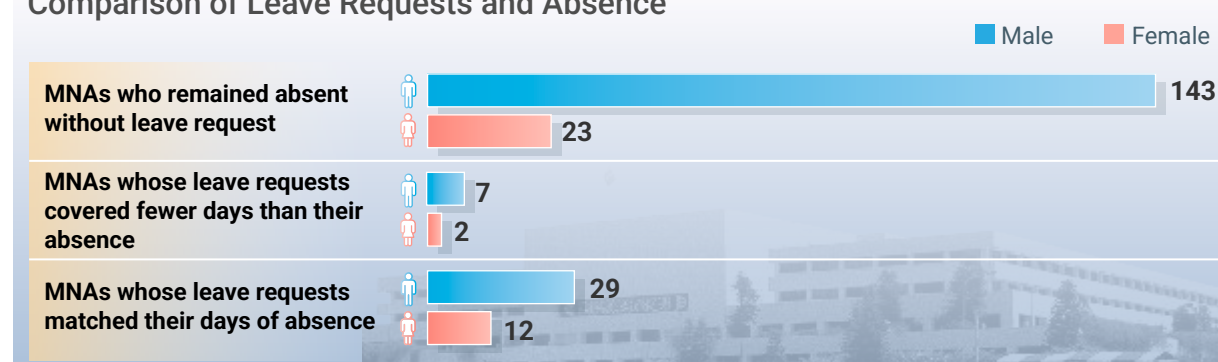
Leave and Absence Patterns

An analysis of attendance records and leave applications announced during the proceedings shows that 216 members (66 percent of the current strength) missed at least one sitting during the session. However, only 50 members (23 percent of those absent) submitted applications seeking leave from the House for their absence. Among these 50 applicants, 16 members (32 percent) applied for leave in advance, while seven members (14 percent) submitted applications ex post facto, that is, after returning from their leave. The applications of the remaining 27 members (54 percent) were read out on a day that fell in the middle of their absence period. Furthermore, 41

members (82 percent of applicants) sought approval for the entire duration of their absence, whereas nine members (18 percent) were absent for a longer period than the number of days for which they had requested a leave. A significant majority of 166 members (77 percent of those who missed at least one sitting) remained absent without submitting any application during the session. However, they may submit leave applications in subsequent sessions. In addition, seven MNAs applied for leave during this session for their absences in previous sessions. Figure 3 presents a gender-wise comparative analysis of leave requests and absences.

Comparison of Leave Requests and Absence

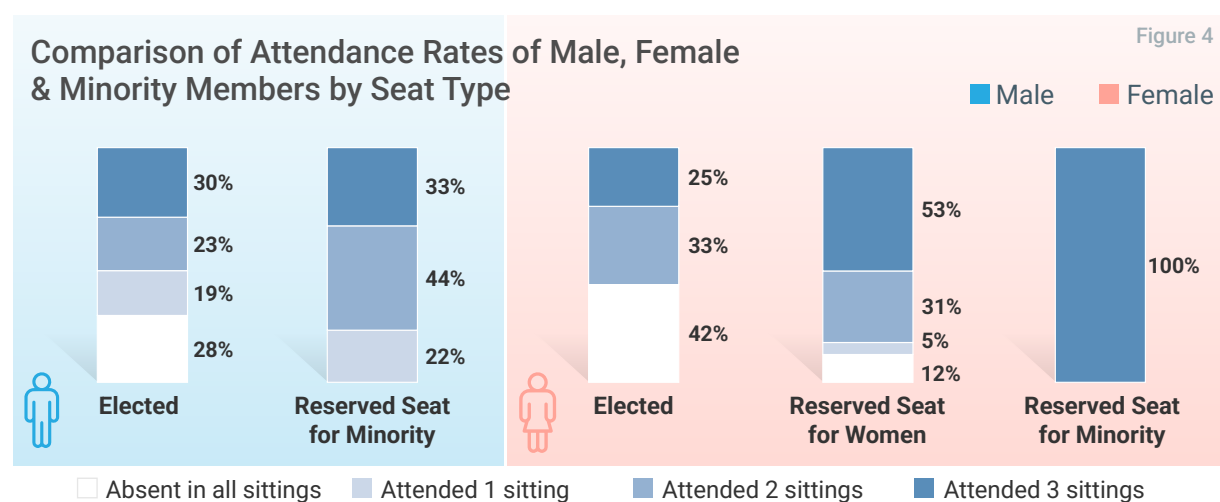

Attendance Patterns by Gender

A total of 35 female MNAs, comprising 31 on seats reserved for women, three on general seats, and one on a seat reserved for minorities (constituting 49 percent of the total female membership), attended all sittings. Conversely, 12 MNAs (representing 17 percent of the total membership), including seven on reserved seats for women and five on general seats, did not attend any of the sittings. Among 10 minority members (including one female member), eight attended more than half of the sittings, with one female and three male members attending all

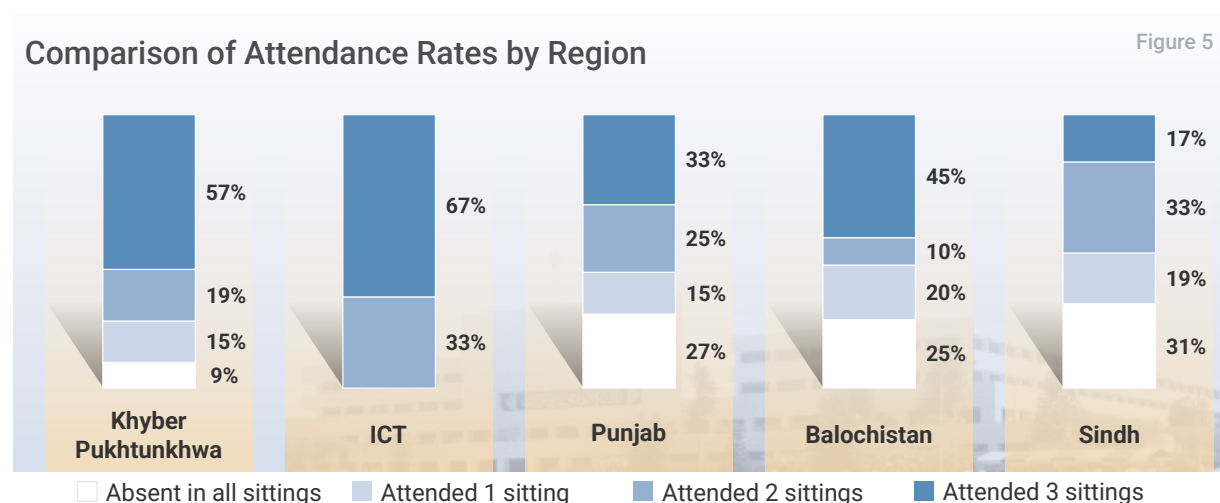
sittings, while two attended less than half of the sittings. Among male MNAs elected on general seats, 70 (28 percent) did not attend any of the sittings, 47 (19 percent) attended less than half of the sittings, and 129 (52 percent) attended more than half of the sittings, including 73 (30 percent) who were present during all sittings. Overall, the attendance of MNAs exhibited a noticeable decline compared to the previous session for both genders. Figure 4 presents a comparative analysis of attendance rates disaggregated by seat type and gender.



Attendance Patterns by Region

Regionally, across all provinces, the majority of MNAs attended more than half of the sittings. All MNAs from Islamabad Capital Territory (ICT) attended more than half of the sittings (including two MNAs who attended all sittings), Khyber Pakhtunkhwa's 40 MNAs (75 percent) attended more than half of the sittings, including 30 who were present during all sittings. Punjab saw 98 MNAs (58 percent) attend more than half of the

sittings, with 56 attending every sitting. From Balochistan, 11 MNAs (55 percent) attended more than half of the sittings, including nine who were present at all sittings. In Sindh, 41 MNAs (51 percent) participated in more than half of the sittings, including 14 who attended all the sittings. Figure 5 presents a region-wise analysis of attendance rates.



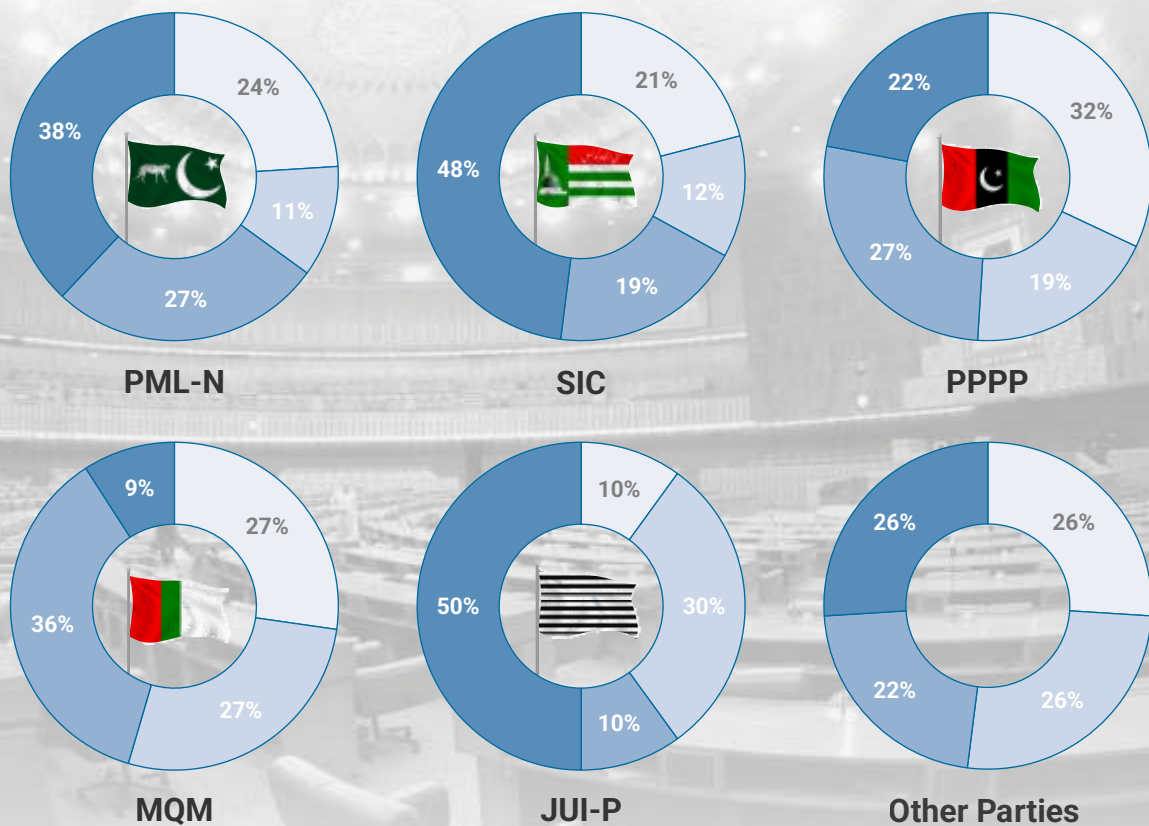
■ Attendance Patterns by Party

Most legislators from the Sunni Ittehad Council (SIC), Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz (PML-N), and Jamiat Ulama-e-Islam Pakistan (JUIP) attended more than one sitting. The sole representatives of the Majlis-e-Wahdat-ul-Muslimeen Pakistan (MWMP) and the National Party (NP) achieved full attendance. Members from the Balochistan Awami Party (BAP) also

attended more than one sitting. Conversely, the sole representative of the Pakistan Muslim League-Zia (PML-Z) attended only one sitting, and the sole representative of the Pakhtunkhwa Milli Awami Party (PKMAP) did not attend any sitting. Figure 6 illustrates the attendance rates categorized by parliamentary parties.

The bar titled "Other Parties" covers all parties with fewer than eight MNAs, including BAP, MWMP, NP, PKMAP, PML, PML-Z, and IPP. BNP's sole lawmaker has announced submitting his resignation, which is yet to be officially accepted, as the National Assembly website currently shows him as a member.

Ministerial Attendance

During the session, nine ministers were scheduled to respond to the members' questions. However, only one minister was present. Although the Question Hour was deferred to allow discussion on the flood situation, the ministries whose questions were to be taken up had already been decided in advance, reflecting the importance of their duties. Notably, 10 MNAs holding the portfolio of Federal Ministers and five MNAs holding the portfolio of Ministers of State did not attend any sitting of the session. This high rate of absenteeism among cabinet members, particularly during deliberations on the flood situation, a matter of urgent national concern, raises serious questions about the level of commitment with which ministers approach

their constitutional responsibilities. The suspension of the regular agenda to prioritize this critical issue underscores the gravity of their absence.

On a positive note, four Federal Ministers, namely the Ministers for the Public Affairs Unit, Housing and Works, Poverty Alleviation and Social Safety, and Defence, attended all sittings. Similarly, the Minister of State for Railways, who also holds the additional charge of Head of the Prime Minister's Delivery Unit, was present in every sitting. Figures 7 and 8 show the number of sittings each cabinet member from the Lower House attended, based on official records available on the National Assembly website.

The incumbent cabinet comprises the Prime Minister and 31 Federal Ministers including 25 MNAs and Six Senators. The cabinet members from the Senate are not ordinarily required to attend the Assembly's session unless there's an agenda item pertaining to their ministry. In addition to the Federal Ministers, as many as 11 Ministers of State including 10 MNAs and one non-elected person hold the office of the Ministers of State and 24 of the Parliamentary Secretaries.

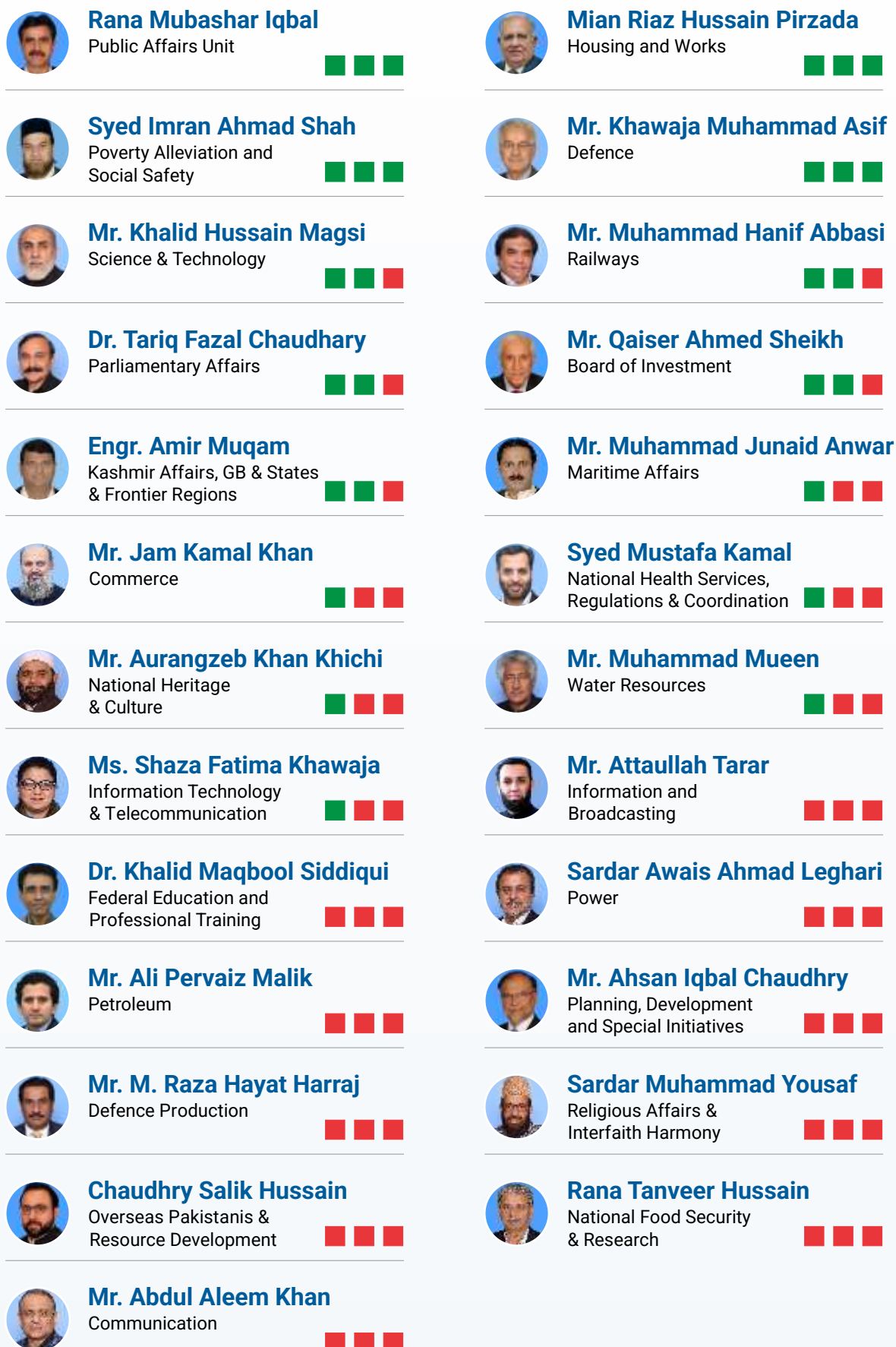

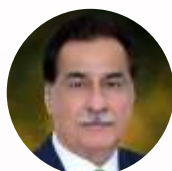

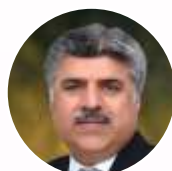

The Attendance Report Card of the Members of the National Assembly of Pakistan is an initiative by the Free and Fair Election Network (FAFEN) aimed at promoting transparency and accountability by making the performance of elected representatives accessible to the public. Their attendance serves as a key indicator of their commitment to legislative responsibilities, including representing their constituents, contributing to policy debates, and holding the government accountable.

This report presents a detailed analysis of MNAs' attendance during the plenary sittings of the National Assembly's 19th session, held from September 1 to September 5, 2025. It provides insights into attendance trends across regions, political parties, and gender, highlighting levels of engagement among lawmakers. The report relies on the verbatim debates for leave records of MNA.

Since 2010, FAFEN has been systematically observing and reporting on the plenary proceedings of the federal Parliament and Provincial Assemblies. These efforts have significantly contributed to enhancing parliamentary transparency and strengthening the connection between citizens and their elected representatives, fostering a more inclusive and accountable democratic process.
